Lesson 3 (pt 1) Forget Me Not

The benefits of memorizing God's word:

- A. Memorizing God's word provides supernatural power:
 - 1. Memorizing God's word enable you to live victoriously over personal sin, (Ps. 119:9-11)
 - 2. Memorizing God's word helps you to focus on the eternal rather than the temporal, (Col. 3:1-2)
 - 3. Memorizing God's word activate weapons for spiritual warfare that defeat the enemy, (Matt. 4:1-11).
 - 4. Memorizing God's word strengthens your faith, (Prov. 22:17-19), "Pay attention and listen to the words of the wise, and apply your heart to my teaching, 18 for it is pleasant when you treasure them within you and have them ready on your lips. 19 As a result, your

- trust will be in the LORD, that's why I'm teaching you today, even you.
- 5. Memorizing God's word prepares you for witnessing and problem solving, (I Peter 3:15, Matt. 22:15-46)
- 6. Memorizing God's word provides guidance from God regarding His will, (Ps. 119:24; Isa. 30:22)
- 7. Memorizing God's word helps you to develop the skill of meditation, (Ps. 119:97).

B. You can memorize scripture:

- 1. Have a plan
- 2. Use the topical approach for example use "Love". Then find scriptures about love.
- 3. Write out the verse
- 4. Visualize the word, Recite it verbally.
- 5. Repeat the verse-seeing it, hearing it, repeating it, and saying it, enable you to get it. Get an accountability partner, (Prov. 27:17)
